New rules for posting political ads now go through a robust verification process including SS#, DL photo ID. Verified ads will include a "paid for" label on the ad that allows the viewer to see an archive of all previous ads.

Constitution Minute with Chris Wright

- Chris gave an overview of the Masterpiece Cakeshop opinion. Justice Kennedy based the majority opinion on civil rights laws and not on religious rights. Basically the opinion fell short of supporting religious rights.

The Washington Report with Bill Pascoe:

- Of importance this week is the House's focus on the opioid crisis. The House will take up no less than 26 bills dealing with the opioid crisis.
- This week the Senate passed S 2987 John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act.
- On the entitlement front, the trustees of social security(SS) and disability fund and Medicare/Medicaid fund project Medicare/Medicaid will be depleted by 2026 (three years earlier than in last year's report) and SS fund will be depleted by 2034.
- The DOJ Inspector General Michael Horowitz's report is said to be released on Thursday of this week.
- On the Immigration front, no agreements have been made by the House Republicans on how to handle the amnesty issue but they agree to continue discussions. The House Republicans currently fall into three distinct groups: One group wants to create a pathway to citizenship. The second group wouldn't mind seeing a pathway to citizenship but don't want to be criticized for supporting amnesty. The third group does not want a pathway to citizenship of any kind in accordance to the rule of law.
- On the Iran front, Sen Rob Portman revealed in the investigative report from the Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations details for the first time how the Obama Administration secretly granted a specific license authorizing the conversion of Iranian assets worth billions of U.S. dollars using the US financial system. The Obama administration asked two US banks to execute the transactions and they refused to do so.
- Former Senate Intelligence Committee aide James A. Wolfe was arrested on Thursday and charged with leaking sensitive/classified information to the media.

- On the North Korean front, President Trump will meet with NK president Kim Jong-un in Singapore to begin negotiations on denuclearizing North Korea.
- On the trade front President Trump attended the G7 summit in Canada
